The aim of the seminar to enhance the understanding of one of the central categories for cultural analysis dealt with in the Introduction to Cultural Studies. Students will get to know theories of masculinity and queerness and discuss concepts like post-feminism. In the second part of the seminar, they will get the opportunity to do their own research and analysis of representations of gender – from James Bond to Fleabag.
